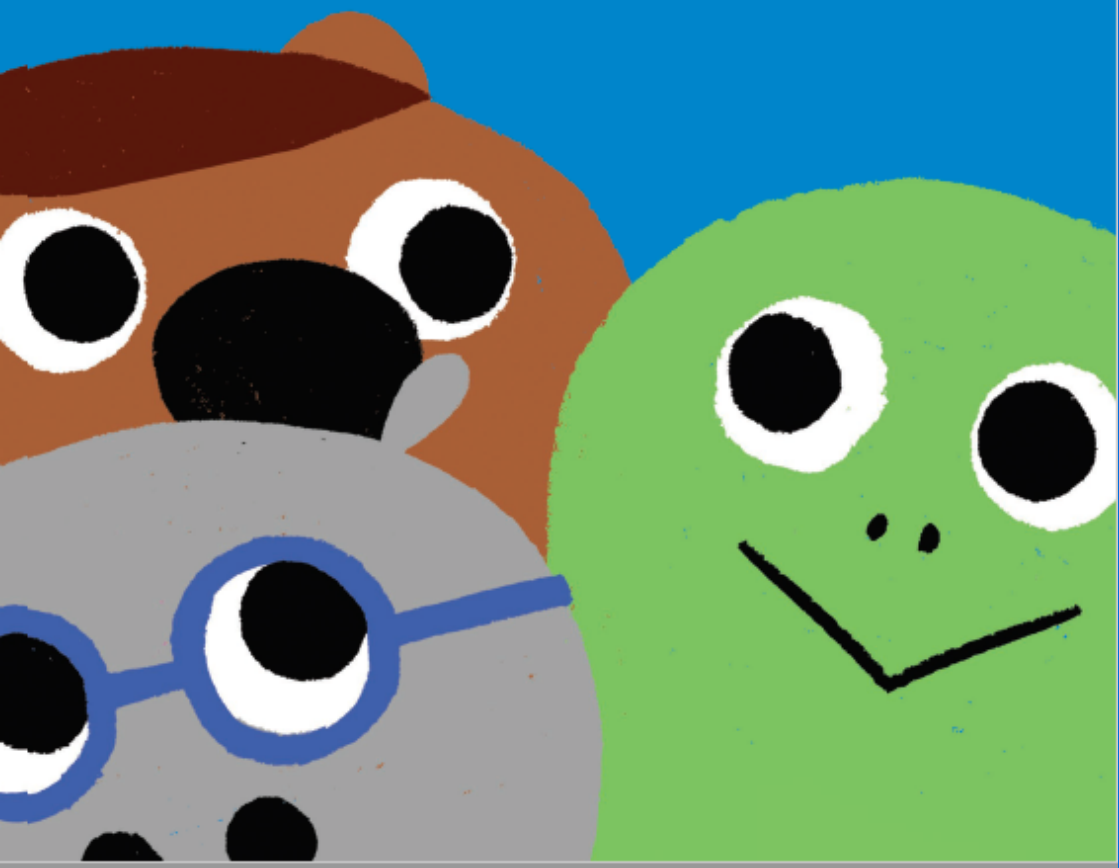

How to earn your badge

- Design a cover for your favourite book and tell your Colony, Lodge, Explorer Scout Young Leader or Beaver Leader why this book is your favourite.
- Read at least six books. Books you have read on an e-reader count too. Books read on e-book readers count too
- Show that you know how to look after a book.
- Make a bookmark and explain what bookmarks are for.

To show that your Beaver has completed the above tasks, you could post photos of them reading their chosen books, the book cover and the bookmark. You could also post a short video on our closed parent Facebook page of them telling us which is their favourite book and why, explaining how to look after a book and what bookmarks are for

How to earn your badge

- Show that you can:
 - turn on and log into a computer
 - use a piece of software, for example email or a game
 - name the main parts of a computer system
 - connect a peripheral (for example a scanner or printer) to your computer and use it.
- Create a piece of digital media. It could be artwork, a photograph, music or animation.
- Use the internet for research:
 - decide on an area of interest
 - find three websites with content that matches your area of interest
 - collect relevant information by printing or saving as files
- Using your internet research, design a presentation and tell others about what you have found out. This could be an electronic or paper based presentation

Again you can use our Facebook page to share photo's and video's of your Beaver completing the tasks. When we return to weekly meetings your Beaver can bring in their artwork and presentation.

How to earn your badge

- Design a model of something you would like to build. The design can be on paper or a computer.
- Make a list of all the things you are going to need to build your idea.
- Build your idea using the things you need. Your model could be made using building blocks, gears or recycled items such as toilet roll tubes or cardboard boxes.
- Explain to your Lodge Leader, Explorer Scout Young Leader or Beaver Leader how long your build took to finish, if anything went wrong and what you would change if you built it again.

To show that your Beaver has completed the above tasks, you could post photos of them completing them. You could also post a short video on our closed parent Facebook page of them making the model and explaining the last task

Beavers Skills Challenge Award



This one follows on from the personal challenge

This Award is split into 4 sections with each section needing the Beaver to complete certain tasks. Here we are concentrating on sections 3 and 5 of the Award.

Section 3: Do two creative activities, these could be

- act or mime
- play a musical instrument
- make a model from salt dough
- make up a dance
- paint a picture
- make a card

Section 5: Learn and use three of these skills

- learn your own address and phone number
- tie your shoelaces
- decorate some cakes or biscuits
- set an alarm clock to get up at the right time in the morning
- fold or roll your scarf
- make your bed
- keep your bedroom tidy
- light a candle
